## Circus Vargas TOUR A WINNER

If ever a circus owner deserves a compliment it is showman Cliff Vargas for his efforts in alerting the general public to the hazards of pending and current animal control laws. At each performance announcer Sandy Dobritch makes an impressive talk about the regulations, urging patrons to contact their elected representatives as a means of rejecting such laws and thereby preserving the circus, as we now know it, for future generations.

Performers of the circus have started to raise money for a fight against the legislation. The public has been asked to help and patrons seem eager to aid the cause.

Throughout its Southern California engagement Circus Vargas has been drawing capacity and turnaway business at each performance. At Corona (Calif.) on April 23rd, the local newspaper carried front page headlines saying "Today Is Circus Day in Corona."

New records in attendance and gross receipts have been recorded at Baltimore (Md) by the Ringling-Barnum Circus. The show played at Baltimore's Civic Center on Mar. 12-23, presenting a total of 23 performances.

Attendance for the engagement totaled 184,508, as compared to 178,336 for the previous year. The gross receipts amounted to \$784,076, up from the \$693,983 reported for 1974.

## Circo Nazionale D'Italia .....by CLARK McDERMOTT

The Circo Nazionale D'Italia is owned and operated by Franco Berosini and family and a better or prettier show would be hard to find.

They use a European type tent, with four king poles set in a square. The canvas is blue and orange and in tip top shape. The side wall is white and blue, and poles are all aluminum. The center section is 40' x 50' and gives ample room for a 40' ring, with a stage behind it, 40'x30'. Each center pole is equipped with a Fire Exit sign.

The bleacher seats are nine high and in front of them are several rows of reserved chairs and then a complete horseshoe of box seats, in individual cubicles made from canvas and steel tubing. Each box contains six seats. In all they have over 4,000 seats, each with a clear view of the performance.

Everything is well painted and neat. Plenty of shavings are in evidence everywhere under the big top. Lighting is more than adequate with Chandeliers and Quartz lights, with a huge star star chandelier in the center of the top, in the Mexican National colors.

Each section of the ring curb has a canvas cover that can be removed and laundered. Props are all kept behind the back drop and brought out only as used. All rigging is fitted with nylon line and kept in good order.

The sound is stereo and very good. They have a sharp operator who catches all the cues.

The show runs about an hour and a half, and is fast paced at all times. Eight prop boys are used and each is costumed like an African native, since this is the general theme of the circus. The trucks are all zebra striped and kept parked around the tent.

The Menagerie is a separate top and also blue and orange. It is kept immaculate and there is plenty of feed and water available at all times. The show is carrying 3 elephants (2 males and a female), 5 camels, a llama tiger, 2 horses and 3 chimps.

The bull truck is cleaned and then both sides are opened and it becomes the Main Entrance and ticket boxes. A small top just behind it holds all the concessions.

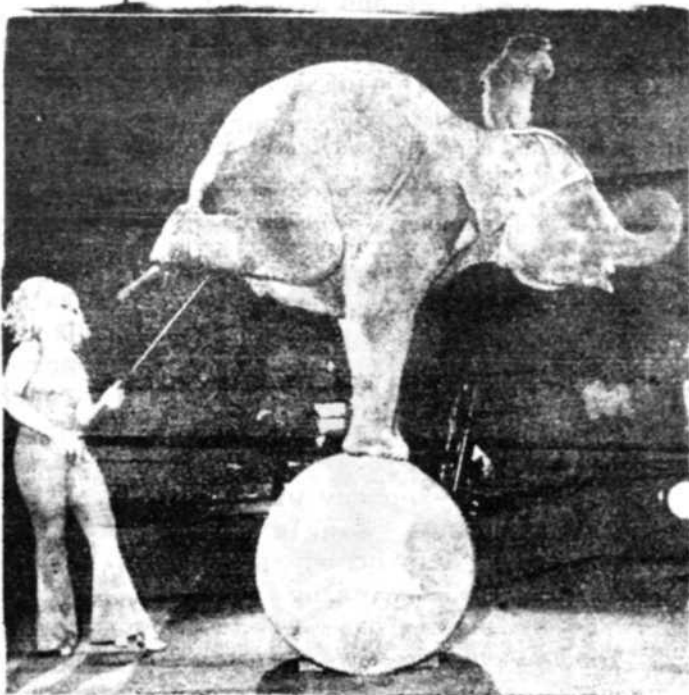
Their numbers included: The Boxing Match, The Long Shirt, Walk-arounds and other crowd pleasing presentations.

There were plenty of TV spots, window cards and newspaper ads announcing that the George Matthews Circus was here in Las Vegas and it seems as if it paid off. The tent was virtually filled for each performance. The circus was set up on the black top, parking lot, of the West Charleston shopping center, obviously a good location.

A few problems developed while here - there were strong winds, which sometimes can get pretty rough in this area, and a section of extra seats collapsed but there was no one in them and they were quickly reset.

During the opening performance several lions got into a brawl and I doubt that the audience realized the potential seriousness of the incident. However, Pauncho handled it well and soon had them back in their regular routines.

Special credit should go to the circus band for their fine musical background. The clowning is done well with Harry Ross and three others, and Dwight Moore's subtle humor and timing is a delight to watch. It is also a treat to watch the new stars -- Tony Nock and Luann Jacobs as they perform in real professional style. There are also other great performers like Billy Barton and Herbie Weber.

All in all, it is a well balanced program with a lot of strength and appeal.

## Carnival Ponies Starved

SACRAMENTO (UPI) — Thirty-one horses, including a herd of former carnival ponies, have been found starving and infested with lice during the past two weeks in Sacramento County.

Phil Steward, executive director of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, also reported Wednesday that one horse was found dead of exhaustion and anemia in Elk Grove.

All the animals were receiving feed and medical attention at a daily cost of \$175, he said.

Steward said some of the 13 former circus ponies "are pregnant and due to deliver any time. They were fed in poor feed conditions, had lice and had been grossly neglected."

The circus ponies were discovered Saturday and were last fed April 16, he said.

The other 18 horses were found April 11 in a south Sacramento field.

# 7-League Boots For an Elephant

It took three full cowhides and cost the county \$400 to make May a pioneer of pachyderm fashion, but the three-ton Asian elephant now sports her first pair of booties at the San Francisco Zoo.

Each gold-colored moccasin with its steel cable laces weighs 13 pounds, has a three-layer nonskid rubber sole and is lined with sterilized cotton soaked in an antiseptic iodine solution.

A 47-year-old mother of four, May has sore feet — an ailment called foot rot and similar to athlete's foot in humans.

In a three-hour operation, two veterinarians and 10 assistants dug fungus and bacterial infection from her feet while May lay anesthetized with an oxygen tube up her five-foot trunk.

The infection had resisted conventional treatment with drugs and Dr. William Mottram, the zoo veterinarian, said that "without surgery the infection would certainly shorten her life.

"This type of infection is similar to a gravel situation in a horse's hoof. The sole of the elephant is specialized horny tissue, and pockets can form around foreign matter as the tissue grows," said Mottram.

John Wolf, the elephant keeper, got the idea of the boots to protect May's feet until they heal. He knew a Berkeley sandal-maker, Joe Bynes, who did the job.

## YEARS AGO

The Sells Floto Circus of 1923 traveled on a total of 29 cars in two sections.

The First Section consisted of 4 horse cars, 7 flats and 3 sleepers, with 27 wagons (2 tractors and one truck).

The Second Section had 3 horse cars, 7 flats and 5 sleepers with 32 wagons (16 cages and a cart).

They also had 113 baggage horses
