In Memoriam

BILLY LELAND, circus clown, died of a heart attack while working in his yard at his Los Angeles (Calif.) home on July 14th.

The show moves on five semi units and two trucks, plus two trailers and ten privately owned house/trailer units. They are carrying 3 elephants, 10 ponies, 4 horses, 4 lions, 3 monkeys, a tiger, bear, baboon, llama and a donkey.

Big top is a 100 ft with two 30 ft middles, while the side show is a 60 ft with one 30 ft middle. The midway features a snake show, pony ride, jewelry joint, concessions, elephant ride novelties. Admission prices for the big show are \$1.50 for everyone on advance sale tickets, with door prices set at \$2.00 for the children and \$2.50 for adults.

The 1 hour and 15 minute show, with no intermission, features: Opening spec; Trampoline; Clowns; Virginia Rayborn and Toni Frazier, ladders; Cathy Rawls, wire; Bonny Bonta, dogs; Clowns; Dave Knodder, high school horse; The Fraziers and The Rawls, rola bolas; Clowns; Trained llama; Dave Knodder, ponies (6); Virginia Rayborn, web and Richard Forrest with "Big Ellie" the elephant

Also on the midway is Dave Knodder's calliope and concerts are given before and after every performance.

OHIO REPORT

HOXIE'S GREAT AMERICAN CIRCUS -
Parklayne, Ohio - July 9th.

The midway really looks great with the freshly painted and well lettered trucks. It is no doubt the most colorful show on the road today.

The main feature of the Side Show is "Kongo" the biggest ape to be seen anywhere. The top was really wild, with yellow, blue and white striped canvas on one end, and red, white and blue on the other end. Also forming the midway is a Himalayan Monster Pit Show, concessions, a ticket wagon and elephant rides.

The big show was well reviewed in CR on June 28 by Billy Barton. Here the biggest flaw was the sound system, which made it difficult to understand Charles Moyer's announcements. He also directs the three piece band - trumpet, drums and organ.

Dime Wilson, Jr. has the kids roaring with his ladder routine, especially when he falls down and ends back up on his feet. Buck Nolan and Giovanni Zoppe are also in Clown Alley.

The Alberto Zoppe lion act is a good one, as is their Riding School number. Billy Gunga's 3 yr old twins really steal the audience's heart and great crowd pleasers. The feature act is the Kneisley Duo's cradle number, presented by Donna Wilson and Bill Bannister.

The Carson & Barnes Circus has the biggest menagerie and herd of elephants that one can see anywhere. The menagerie, in charge of Don Carr, features 33 elephants, 1 giraffe, 2 zebras, 3 ostriches, 5 black goats, a brown goat, deer, 4 llamas, 2 camels, buffalo, midget steer, 2 donkeys, 8 lions, 4 bears, 6 tigers, plus 2 leopards.

On the midway is a pony ride moon bounce, ape show, concession stands, and the side show, with banners and a big sho ticket office. Working on the bally were a fire eater, sword swallower and snake charmer.

The big show band is directed by Col. Les Harkness and consists of 3 trumpets, 2 trombones, a bass, baritone and drums. The announcements are handled by Dan Thompson, who also works the elephants.

The show trucks all have the title on the cab, plus they read Rented from Miller Equipment Co.
